The Museum is a registered charity, which does not receive any revenue subsidies. You can support our work by becoming an individual, family or corporate member or by joining our volunteer team.

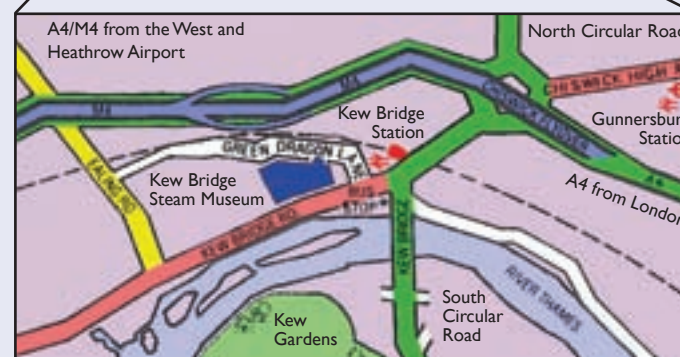
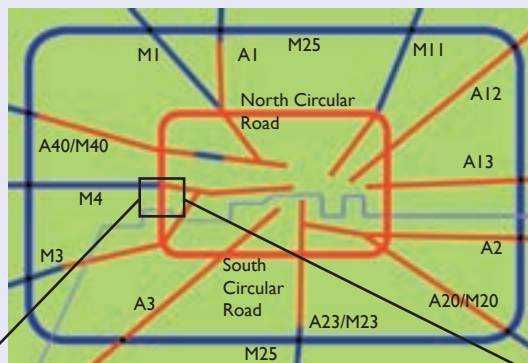
